Holy Communion

As a parish over past years we had been very careful to protect the most vulnerable. One such precaution was sharing communion from a single chalice at the front of church through the use of individual cups in the pews. As we learn to live with COVID, Rev Jonny would like to give our parishioners the opportunity to resume coming to the front again, but mindful of the need for safety. Therefore from **Christmas Eve Communion**, he plans to offer the following options for people: -

- 1. Continue with the existing sealed cups, collect from rear of church and sit in the pews using these during the service, or;
- 2. During the administration of communion, members have the option to come forward to the Communion rail and receive bread (where tongs will be used to avoid contamination) and individual cups of wine.

What is the Point?

Mission Allocation 2022
