CMS Ireland has been involved with the Tujisaidie Project since 1992 formerly known as the Urban Development Programme (UDP) which was started in 1991 in order to look after 350 families, who were displaced from their homes in slum demolitions.

Today the Project works with the local community to improve health and sanitation, encourage education through the Tujisaidie Community Centre School and nurture income-generating activities. Through the Tumaini African Foundation (TAF) there is a special focus on engaging with youth through sports ministry, a library/Youth Centre and the 'Morethanjustameal' food programme.

Through these things the Project is seeking to make the love of Christ visible at the heart of the community.

CMSI has helped support many Tujisaidie initiatives, including water provision, nursery and primary education, sanitation, community health education.

- Procure 2 pop-up banners for CMSI partnership for both churches 
- Quarterly CMSI Information leaflet to be handed out to people at the end of church services 

-  Pastoral visiting team to distribute quarterly CMSI Information leaflet to household parishioners
-  Prayer points to be fed into monthly Prayer Warriors leaflet by CMSI Parish Co-ordinator
-  Continue to support CMSI & the Tujisaidie & Tumaini projects through our annual tithe

-  Identify specific needs from our global partners that require financial support, and agree ways of fundraising for these





- Establish a relationship between the youth of our parish and the youth in Nairobi to grow links for the future 
- Rev Jonny to visit our global partners in Nairobi in 2023 to establish strong links for the future and bring feedback to the parish 

- Establish a half yearly Bible study morning using Zoom between the parish and our global partners in Nairobi, facilitated by CMSI 






- Establish a regular pattern to include specific prayers for Tujisaidie & Tumaini into our Sunday prayers of intercession

- The parish to receive a half-yearly video from Kenya updating parish on recent developments 
- Develop our social media resources/ volunteer to provide regular CMSI updates onto Facebook & website 
- To trial a pilot series of Bible studies using Zoom between the parish youth discipleship group and our global partners in Nairobi 
- Continue activities of previous year 



-  Tujisaidie to provide recorded videos of scripture readings and leading intercessions to use in our Sunday services
-  Tujisaidie and the United Parish to send each other prayer requests as and when issues arise
-  Provide a facility for parishioners who wish to give directly to CMSI/Tujisaidie/Tumaini
-  Establish an annual visit from CMSI to our morning services to provide teaching and an update on CMSI's mission and work
-  Tujisaidie to contribute articles & photos to the parish to include in a news update 2 or 3 times per year

- Prepare for a future visit either to our partners in Kenya or from our partners to Northern Ireland in 2025 
- Work with Antony & others on how we should communicate the mission of our parish to our partners in Kenya 

- Invite churches in Ireland that share the partnership with Tujisaidie & Tumaini projects to gather annually: 
 - to learn from each other
 - to pray and worship together
 - to encourage one another
 - to work closer together
- Invite CMSI Speaker to Mothers' Union
