Our partners in Tujisaidie, Nairobi have sent an update on the ongoing development of the Primary School

After weeks of hard work by Isabelle (with help from Lucy, head teacher John and Misean Cara Kenya mentor Paul Gichuki), Tujisaidie School finally submitted a €90,000 proposal to demolish the old single-storey wing and re-build it with two storeys. This has been supplemented by a generous grant of €9,000 from Electric Aid, plus co-funding from CMSI link

parishes and supporters. Work has now begun on the project which will enable the School to make significant improvements creating 3 new classrooms and much-needed extra resources.
