Prayer Points from Revd Jonny

Like the Apostle Paul wrote on many occasions, I give thanks for the faithful witness of our church in the community of Ballyclare and Ballynure. Pray that we would never lose our passion and fervour for the Good News message of the risen Lord Jesus Christ, and the hope that he brings to every person.

Pray for every person that teaches within our church family, whether from the front of our churches, in our bible study and home groups, that they would remain faithful to God's word and not veer away from it as other churches are doing (2 Timothy 4:3-4).

In this month with the forthcoming General Synod of the Church of Ireland (10th & 11th May) in Armagh, pray for those members gathering from across Ireland that they would be guided by the Holy Spirit in all the decisions they make for the life of God's Church.

Pray for our young people – they have so much to contribute to the life of our church and are a powerful witness of God's love in our community. Pray that God would guide those who have any school exams, that they would know God has incredible plans for their lives and it is his provision that will sustain them and not this world's.

Pray for our newly appointed Select Vestry as they oversee the operational issues within the life of our parish, and those people who have been appointed to specific roles in both churches. Pray that they would know God's strength in the year ahead.

Continue to pray for our church family in Christ Church, that it would grow in number, with an increase in young families.

Pray that God will provide the resources necessary for these important tasks.

Pray for the paperwork that needs completed to allow the advertising of the Christ Church Organist / Music Direct role to go out. This is an important role for the parish, and sometimes the other pressing demands on me prevent me from getting through the to-do list.

Pray for our current staff – for Chris McCabe as Music Ministry lead for St John's and David Brown as Parish Administrator. Thank God for their support to me and their dedicated commitment to see Christ proclaimed across the parish.
